The newly formed Girl Scout troop (pictured above) meets at Our House each Monday afternoon and is comprised of both Daisies/Brownies (grades 1-3) and Juniors (grades 4-5). These girls are enthusiastic about their participation and have also engaged the interest of some of their moms. They recently hosted their mothers/grandmothers at a parent meeting and dinner, where the girls (with help from the Troop Leader) prepared and served Brownie stew, garlic cheese bread and pudding parfait. It was a wonderful evening!



One of our 7th grade boys, Zion Reed, joined the Boys Scouts at the start of the school-year and has consistently participated in Troop 15 meetings – recently going on his first canoe-camp out. He is quite proud of his uniform and manual, which were purchased

with funds provided by another generous donor.

The Jason Dufner Charitable Foundation insured that Our Kids were ready to go back to school by providing supplies and paying for locker fees, computer user fees and the like. And, thanks to a faithful donor, we were also able to purchase each of the kids a new backpack of their own choosing.

Specific needs for school clothes and shoes were met by contributions made for this specific purpose. All of this allowed Our Kids to begin the year with



confidence and without concern over how they would get all that they needed for school.

Many are volunteering their time and resources by tutoring, or providing, preparing and serving snacks to roughly 30 kids per day. Others are helping fund our monthly expenses through their financial contributions and many are praying.
